Dear Friends in the Middle Atlantic Region,

Jacob spends a long, restless night alone. He wrestles until dawn with an unseen figure and limps away forever changed. That moment, in this week's Torah portion Vayishlach (Genesis 32:4–36:43), captures the essence of Jewish leadership: struggle, transformation, and courage.

Leadership begins in that lonely space—where fear and faith meet, where a person confronts what they'd rather avoid. Jacob's courage wasn't in winning the fight but in staying with it until morning. The men and youth we honor this year embody that same courage: the quiet persistence to keep showing up for others, even when it's hard, uncertain, or thankless.

When Jacob finally meets Esau, he bows seven times and chooses peace. After years of conflict, he leads with humility, not pride. That's leadership—not control, but repair. It's the ability to bridge divides, to build trust after distance, to replace fear with understanding. Our honorees model this through mentorship, service, and care for their communities. They remind us that strong leadership isn't about having followers; it's about creating more leaders.

Later in Vayishlach, Jacob limps forward—wounded but wiser. Every leader carries such marks: the cost of effort, the scars of commitment. Yet those marks become signs of growth, not defeat. True leadership in Jewish life means bearing those experiences and transforming them into empathy, resilience, and hope.

As we gather to celebrate this year's Man and Youth of the Year, we honor those individuals who lead in that spirit—who wrestle with responsibility and still choose generosity; who know that faith without struggle is fragile, and struggle without faith is empty. May their example remind us that leadership, like Jacob's journey, is never finished. It's a constant return to purpose, to people, and to God.

Mazel Tov to our honorees, and kol hakavod to all who continue to lead with humility, courage, and love for the Jewish people.


